6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$300,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of Communities Organized to Improve Life, Inc. for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, and capital equipping of two properties that will serve as community and school centers providing academic, senior, and family support services.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

This bill requires a matching fund that may consist of real property, in-kind contributions, and funds expended prior to the effective date of the Act.

8. Special Provisions

No part of the proceeds of the bonds or the matching funds may be used for sectarian relgious purposes.

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

Communities Organized to Improve Life, Inc. (COIL) is a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the overal health and well-being of the residents of the communities of Southwest Baltimore. Its mission is to involve neighborhood people in devising solutions for the physical, economic and social issues facing the Southwest Community.

Communities Organized to Improve Life, Inc. proposes to support and strengthen academic opportunities, senior citizen quality of life and family support services rendered to the youth, seniors and families of Southwest Baltimore by facilitating a collaborative coordination of these activities with the community and the Baltimore City School System. The proposed project will enable coordinated community based youth services and family support services to be housed in area southwest schools, and after school programming, career internships, student work programs, recreation programs a full service senior center and various other community service and activies to be houses and facilitated in the community at selected community satellite sites.

10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

Factors such as drug abuse, HIV and AIDS, parent incarceration, poverty, child abuse and neglect, illiteracy and youth and family homelessness have caused many households to be torn apart resulting in Baltimore's children failing both socially and academically. Communities Organized to Improve Life, Inc. seeks to address these factors by facilitating the implementation of a multifaceted holistic approach to community and school coordination of services. Currently, there are no community school collabortives in the catchment area of Communities Organized to Improve Life, Inc. that offer this type of holistic coordination in specific with a senior intergenerational component.

To meet this demand for coordination of community and school resources, Communities Organized to Improve Life, Inc. has acquired two 15 years lease for properties located in the Southwest Community of Baltimore City for the purpose of revenovating and build community sites to house academic support services such as after school programming, career internships, student work programs and recreation, an array of senior and community services and activities.

The total square footage of the buildings to be renovated is 27,172 square feet and Communities Organized to Improve Life, Inc. proposes to have the buildings renovated by August of 2006. This project will serve 750 people annually and create 72 jobs.
