Wicomico County - Board of License Commissioners - Authority and Status as State Agency

This bill provides that the Wicomico County Board of License Commissioners is a State agency that administers the alcoholic beverages laws and may grant, refuse, revoke, or suspend licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill clarifies current law.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law/Background: State law does not specifically indicate that a county board of license commissioners is a State agency. However, State law (Article 2B, 15-108) does provide that the Garrett County Liquor Control Board is a State agency.

Despite the lack of a specific statutory provision asserting that a board of license commissioners is a State agency, there is evidence that the boards are considered State agencies. As discussed above, State law specifically identifies the Garrett County Liquor Control Board as a State agency, which, despite its name, functions as a board of license commissioners. The Maryland Tort Claims Act defines State personnel, in part, to mean a member of a board of license commissioners of a county. Additionally, an Attorney

General's Opinion, 64 Op. Att'y Gen. 151, 155 (1979), concluded that members of a board of license commissioners are officers in the Executive Branch of State government.
