9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

The Pocomoke Marketing Partnership was formed in November of 1997 to study the feasibility of opening a waterfront museum depicting life in and on the Pocomoke River. A study completed by the Project Management Group at Salisbury University in October of 1997 called for the development of such a museum. The group has worked until the present day to bring this project to fruition. We are now at the point where we are seeking funds for exhibits, having received sufficient funding to complete both the exterior and interior renovation of the building at 2 Market St. in downtown Pocomoke. We have been successful due in large measure to the diverse and talented people who are Board members. A dynamic mix of government officials and persons from the private sector have combined to make this project a reality. The President is Barbara Tull, who owned a clothing store in the downtown for many years. Ms. Tull was also President of the Downtown Pocomoke Association. City officials active in the group include Town Manager Russell Blake and City Councilman Robert Hawkins. Active county officials include Worcester County Commissioner John E. ("Sonny") Bloxom; Lisa Challenger, the Tourism Director; and Jerry Redden, the Economic Development Director.

10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The Delmarva Discovery Center will interpret the rich tradition of life in and on the Pocomoke River.Exhibits will cover the following subjects: ship building, the importance of maintaining a healthy river, "hands-on" discovery items, the life of the Native Americans in the area, terrariums and aquariums, the salt marsh environment and the life of the people who lived along the river. The center is expected to open in early 2008. Previous bond bill monies funded a portion of the costs of the exterior renovation. We are requesting Bond Bill funding specifically for the purchase of the steamboat exhibit. This will be a full-size replica of the type of steamboat which plied the river in the 19th century. Our cost estimates and designs were developed by Doug Mund of Groveland, Massachusetts. Mr. Mund also designed the exhibits for the Virginia Maritime Museum in Virginia Beach, Virginia. Close to the steamboat will be an exhibit wall describing the shipbuilding industry which was prevalent in the 19th century. In front of a dock will be seen the various wares and products that might have travelled the river. Voices will be heard discussing travel on the Pocomoke. Real water tanks at the dock will bring the dock sequence to life with lapping water. The visitors will be able to walk onto the steamboat and will be able to see such things as a storeroom filled with materials, the engine room, and the pilot house. They will also be able to sit on a bench next to a person dressed in traditional clothing who will tell his story. At a predetermined time, the paddlewheel will begin to move. Always in the background one will be able to hear the rumble of the steam engine. The visitor will also be able to see a mannequin at the helm with various charts and artifacts. A docent will act as a deckhand telling stories of the trips on the river, including tales of past captains. Throughout the steamboat experience, the use of actual artifacts will reinforce the historical nature of the exhibit.
