9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

Citizens Care and Rehabilitation Center is a 184 bed skilled facility located in Havre de Grace and has been in operation since 1967 providing excellent health care to the residents for more than thirty-eight years. It provides skilled and intermediate care. Citizens Care and Rehabilitation Center is operated with a mandated mission to provide twenty-four hour nursing care regardless of anyone's ability to pay. The Center employs a staff of 250 people, along with 150 volunteers. It is also capable of caring for 184 residents.

For over thirty-eight years, we have provided every resident at Citizens with love, respect and the best personal care possible. We will continue to honor this commitment to our residents and the community now and into the future. We are dedicated to our families and the community to continue to be a leader in long-term care. Citizens Care and Rehabilitation Center invites people to visit our home where the goal of our entire staff is to professionally serve each resident.

Citizens Care and Rehabilitation Center, created by an act of the State Legislature in 1963, is a comprehensive care facility certified and licensed for Medicare and Medicaid recipients and private pay residents.

Environmental impacts of health, safety and well-being dictate redesigning resident living areas and other areas utilized by residents and families for social and recreational activities. Citizens Care and Rehabilitation Center's needs are to make resident living areas and other areas utilized by our residents more pleasant and safe in which to live. This includes renovation and modernization of our facilities.

Planned renovations include updates to the existing facility, and expanding the rehabilitation department to accommodate outpatient services. Facility updates consist of creating more private rooms, more bathrooms, upgrades to the heating and ventilation systems, the addition of administrative office space, new nurses stations, lounges, physical fitness center, hallways, resident rooms, exterior walls and a possible third floor.

Citizens Care and Rehabilitation Center remains a viable entity to provide twenty-four hour nursing care, including supervised activities, physical and occupational therapies, Alzheimer's and dementia care, among other services.

Citizens Care and Rehabilitation Center offers a wide range of facilities for our residents and their families. Our current facilities allow us to provide excellent care for our residents, while maintaining a "home-like" atmosphere. Our facility offers twenty-four hour nursing care, private and semi-private rooms, recreational areas and enclosed courtyard. We also have an in-house pharmacy, beauty salon and barbershop, gift shop and rehab therapy department.

There is a wealth of things to do and see at Citizens Care and Rehabilitation Center to keep our residents as busy as they'd like to be including daily indoor and outdoor activities.

10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The majority of the beds are in double occupancy rooms, sharing a toilet room with another double room. An improvement in this situation is needed and justified. The Center does not currently offer assisted living, adult day care or a dedicated dementia unit, although a substantial number of current residents are at this level.

The completion of this project will enhance Citizens Care and Rehabilitation Center's current role as a "home away from home" for many people who need round the clock twenty-four hour nursing care. As well, establishing permanent homes for those folks in need of constant health care will leverage Citizens Care and Rehabilitation Center's long-standing role as a nursing facility dedicated to the well-being of thousands of citizens of Harford County and the State of Maryland and the City of Havre de Grace.

The exterior envelope has two areas of concern. The largest concern here is the windows which are the original aluminum frame, single-glazed windows without a thermal break. These windows represent a source of energy loss, condensation build-up and some draft/discomfort for the residents. The other major issue is the architectural precast panels. The 1' thick panels are warped and have pulled away from the back-up wall resulting in joint sealant failures around the panels and windows. These joint breaches have resulted in significant water infiltration and interior wall damage.

In general, this facility appears institutional and in need of a facelift. There is no variety or change in character from one wing to the next. The shared bathrooms are undesirable and considered "nonresidential". Lighting throughout the entire facility is a concern. Common spaces have a lot of glare.

Facade restoration will cut down on energy loss, cut down on moisture penetration and improve the overall appearance of the building. A more residential appearance might be beneficial.

Modernizing the entrances will improve the building's visual accessibility.

Modernizing the building's mechanical, electrical and plumbing systems are necessary and will improve immediately on quality of life and life cycle costs.
