House Bill 332 Appropriations (Delegate Jones, et al.)

Budget and Taxation

Higher Education - Auxiliary and Academic Facilities Bond Authority - Morgan State University

This bill increases the bonding authority of Morgan State University (MSU) from \$77 million to \$88 million.

The bill takes effect June 1, 2006.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Bond revenues and expenditures would increase by up to \$11.0 million in FY 2007 if all the additional bonding authority is used. Higher education expenditures would increase by an estimated \$882,700 annually beginning in FY 2008 to pay debt service on the additional bonds.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Minimal.

Analysis

Current Law: The aggregate principal amount of bonds issued by MSU may not exceed \$77 million.

Background: MSU has \$66.4 million of outstanding academic and auxiliary debt in fiscal 2006 and has tentative plans to issue an additional \$18 million of auxiliary debt in fiscal 2007 in order to pursue housing expansion opportunities. The current \$77 million statutory debt ceiling would prevent the university from moving forward with these plans.

State Fiscal Effect: Academic and auxiliary bond revenues and expenditures for MSU could increase by up to \$11 million in fiscal 2007. MSU estimates that debt service on the bonds would increase higher education expenditures by \$882,668 annually for 20 years if the full authority is used.
