Authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of \$500,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of The Place of Grace Foundation, Inc. for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, and capital equipping of the Grace Center for Community and Economic Development. Heights

### 7. Matching Fund Requirements

The grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund of \$250,000. The matching fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of the Act.

### 9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

The Place of Grace Foundation, Inc. (TPOGF) is a non-profit service organization with a mission is to empower the underprivileged by serving those in need and educating people, thereby helping to transition entire communities into economic stability and social success. The long-term goals for TPOGF are to inspire a spirit of self-determination and personal responsibility in underprivileged communities and to cultivate economic and social growth by ensuring that young people and adults are properly educated. We have established an operational structure that consists of two "lines of service" – Outreach and Education. To date, the organization has two programs under the Outreach service sector, which are listed below:

- Grace in Need is a program that assists underprivileged men, women and children in providing for their daily needs. We provide hot meals, clothing and informational services on job placement, housing, healthcare, and treatment for substance abuse and mental illness; and
- Grace Outreach to Youth and Young Adults (GOYA) (formerly Grace Outreach for Teens is a program designed to provide assistance to inner-city youth (ages 7 to 19) who are at risk of poverty, crime, drugs, and other unfortunate circumstances of underprivileged communities. We sponsor two projects under GOYA: The Job Coop Program and The Hillside Dance and Cheerleading Squad

TPOGF currently has four programs under our Education service sector, which are:

- The John T. Sykes Memorial Scholarship Fund was established in March 2003. Educational scholarships are awarded annually to deserving students in the Washington, DC metro area;
- The Heights Youth Council, a group of youth, 8 to 18 years old, who serve (with their parents) as an advisory arm to the revitalization initiatives in Capitol Heights, District Heights, Seat Pleasant and Fairmount Heights. Members serve as youth ambassadors for our community and partner with local government officials, schools, churches and businesses to lead and involve other youth and their families in community revitalization activities. The fundamental goal for THYC is to equip youth, their parents, and other citizens with life skills that will produce good moral character; enable them to make sound decisions; and become successful leaders.
- Academic Tutoring Program (ATP) is a program that provides children and adults with remedial educational assistance, tutoring, and social enrichment. We have tutoring in the major Romance languages and every other academic subject; and
- The Academy for Forensics and Debate educates and encourages students to participate in the study and practice of forensics, public debate, and civil argument for the purpose of uplifting themselves and their communities. The class for youth introduces young people to the concepts of academic and social forensics, public speaking, acting, critical/analytical thinking, research and debate.

## 10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The Grace Center for Community and Economic Development (Grace Center) will largely contribute to improving many of the social and economic ills that the community is currently experiencing. The purpose of the Grace Center is to provide adults and young adults with the tools to be able to compete in the global business and technology market; and to provide a safe, affordable, nurturing environment for school-age children to receive remedial educational assistance, tutoring, and social enrichment. For children, the Grace Center will promote academic excellence and will have a curriculum that focuses on sharpening reading, math, and computer skills. It will also introduce French, Spanish and other languages and offer tutoring in every academic subject, including computer and technology training. Youth will also participate in group discussions/presentations on conflict resolution, emergency procedures, and multi-cultural awareness. The Center will offer field trips to museums, parks, and cultural events year-round, in addition to academic enrichment.

Adults and young adults will be able to receive literacy, computer, and job skills training. The Center will offer daily courses designed to assist low-income and underprivileged adults and young adults raise their knowledge and skill level in order to acquire better jobs. We will also offer several courses, including: Effective Parenting and Fatherhood; Conflict Resolution; Cooking; Sewing; Financial Literacy; Entrepreneurship and Home-Buying Seminars.
