#### 6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$500,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Trustees of The Maryland Historical Society, Inc. for the planning, design, construction, and capital equipping of a textile gallery and multipurpose classroom.

This bill requires a standard match.

## 9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

In 1844, the Maryland General Assembly chartered the MdHS to preserve and interpret the collective history of the people of Maryland. The oldest continuously operating cultural institution in the state, it is the only state museum of Maryland history. The MdHS seeks to illuminate the past, lend perspective to the present, and inform the future through the acquisition, preservation, and interpretation of manuscripts, archives, and objects that together form the fabric of Maryland history. The MdHS preserves the most significant collection of Maryland cultural artifacts in the world. More than 375,000 objects and 7 million books and documents, all widely recognized as state and national treasures, are preserved in the collection. The MdHS provides exceptional educational services to its diverse audiences. Exhibitions and programs served more than 63,000 Marylanders statewide in 2005. The institution's patrons participate in educational programs, visit the MdHS museum, use the Library, or partake in one of the Society's many other services. Over 48,000 students from 300 Maryland schools participated in MdHS programs and more than 1,900 teachers from counties state-wide attended educational workshops at MdHS during the 2005 academic school year.

# **10. Description and Purpose of Project** (3000 characters maximum)

The capital master plan (a four-phase project) addressed three critical needs identified in the MdHS long range plan;

- to preserve and protect its collections,
- increase space for additional exhibitions, education programs and library resources, and
- increase visibility and assist in the stabilization of the Mt. Vernon cultural district and neighborhood

The capital master plan included renovation of MdHS facilities to meet professional standards for climate control, storage of artifacts and visitor services. Additionally, the plan included expansion of exhibition, research and administrative space through new construction of approximately 50,000 sq. ft. and acquisition of existing buildings within the Mt. Vernon community. Installation of a comprehensive Introduction To Maryland History exhibit as well as a permanent exhibition for the Baltimore City Life Museums collection was included. The master plan incorporated space throughout for expanded educational activities, programs, classes and workshops. Visitor amenities enhancements were included to attract increased audiences to the area and assist with the economic revitalization associated with the Howard Street and West Side development projects.
