#### 6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$50,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Women's Club of Linthicum Heights, Inc. for the construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, and capital equipping of the bathrooms and kitchen for the Women's Club of Linthicum Heights meeting facility.

### 7. Matching Fund Requirements

This bill requires a matching fund that may consist of real property, in-kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of the Act.

# 8. Special Provisions

The bill requires the grantee to convey to the Maryland Historical Trust a perpetual preservation easement to the extent of its interest in the property.

#### 9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

The mission of the Woman's Club of Linthicum since 1940 has been to support youth, community, and those less fortunate here and abroad.

It is an opportunity for members to be involved in many charitable endeavors and at the same time educate ourselves by way of the many speakers invited to the monthly meetings and also to enjoy fellowship by participating in any or all of the many committees.

Some of the activities available to members, other than meetings are; visits to the nursing homes for resident parties, caroling, etc. The clubhouse is used to make nursing home gifts for these parties. Members bring goods to support several homeless shelters for women and men. They also contribute to Unicef and send shoeboxes of supplies oversees by way of the International Committee. There is strong financial support and volunteer time donated to the Ronald McDonald House associated with John's Hopkins Hospital. Donations are also made to the Benson-Hammond Historic House and the Hospice House of Linthicum. Members donated time and money to decorate the Hospice House along with becoming Hospice volunteers.

Members participate in conservation and garden projects, book discussions, poetry parties, and arts & crafts.

The Woman's Club of Linthicum was incorporated in 1940 and established the Linthicum Library and started the first Linthicum kindergarden. The club organizes summer concerts in the park, and provided a permanent bandstand for the concerts. We provided seed money for the Performing Arts Association of Linthicum, work with the Linthicum Shipley Improvement Association on community improvement projects such as; maintaining community garden and area triangles. A committee is in place to clean Linthicum park approximately four times per year. We participate in the Linthicum Community Fair to raise funds and collect can goods for North County Emergency Outreach Network.

To fufill our mission to education and children, we recognize local students with scholarships and outstanding student awards. We sponsor youth art and writing contests, and participate in the North County School and Business Advisory Board. We conduct an all day Community Leader Workshop for all local high school sophmores, at the clubhouse, every fall. We also fund one sophmore's attendance at the Hugh O'Brien Youth Leadership Seminar. Our club purchases dictionaries for worthy students and even presents awards to a teacher on a yearly basis.

# 10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

Our project to renovate the clubhouse for Woman's Club of Linthicum was conceived because of a need for a bathroom on the first floor to accommodate our elderly and disabled members, of which there are many during our 65 years of community service, and also to improve the kitchen and bring it up to standard to meet current fire code. It is our desire to install a new furnace, to include air conditioning, of which there is none currently, for the comfort of members and guests during the months of May-October each year.

The building, built by St. John's Lutheran Church in 1920, purchased by The Women's Club of Linthicum in 1950, needs thirteen (13) replacement windows, along with inner and outer trim. Our organization has always maintained the roof and the outside building to the best of our ability, but we feel, that in this, our 65<sup>th</sup> year, some replacement is necessary. We currently have started a capital improvement fund, and with these funds, replaced damanged ceiling tiles and re-painted the interior, and purchased new curtains for both rooms. We also anticipate replacement/repair needs for the roof, gutters, foundation, and electrical upgrade.

We continue to work toward our goal of beautifying the clubhouse in the near future.
