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6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of \$125,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Ray of Hope Mission Center, Inc. for the planning, design, construction, and capital equipping of the new senior activity center and food pantry building and the acquisition and capital equipping of a mobile soup kitchen for the Ray of Hope Mission Center, located in Port Deposit.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

This bill requires a matching fund of \$31,000. No part of the fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of the Act.

8. Special Provisions

No part of the proceeds of the bonds or the matching funds may be used for sectarian religious purposes.

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

We are a outreach mission located in Western Cecil County, our main goal is to help families who fall thru the cracks, families who have no other place to go for help. We mainly help the elderly, disabled, single parents and grandparents who are raising their grandchildren. We only help families who are trying to change the quality of their lives. Our programs are:

- 1. Free food pantry, we feed 300 families each month.
- 2. Free soup kithen, we feed an average of 90 people a Friday.
- 3. Help with rent evictions and utility disconnects.
- 4. Medical assistance for Doctors visits and med's.
- 5. Misc.needs, filling out job applications, clothing for interviews and work, car repair, GED classes, CPR training, job location, medical transportation and just about anything a family might need.

We have been in operation for 9 years and have a paid staff of 4 people. We work closely with other outreach programs and the Department of Social Services to ensure our families receive the proper assistance they are entitled to.

Our mission statement is simple, we help people who want to change the quality of their lives, not families who want a free handout.

Our budget this year is \$211,000.00, we have over 5,000 families registered with us. 50% are senior's, 20% are on disability and 30% are single parents with children or single adults.

10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The mobile soup kitchen will serve 2 parts of our plan to feed the hungry. First we will deliver a bag lunch to the unemployed families, low income families and to senior's. Their will be no charge or any restrictions for this meal. Everyone who is hungry will be feed. We will pick 1 or 2 housing developments a day and serve the bag lunch until everyone is fed. The 2nd part is a disaster response soup kitchen. This unit will have refrigeration, stove, running water and a generator. We will be able to serve either sandwiches or a hot meal for any natural or man made disaster. This program will also be at no charge to the community. We have contacted the Red Cross and they are ready to set us up in their disaster program to call if there is a need.

Senior recreational center/food pantry--This building will serve two areas, first is a recreational center for our senior's. Our senior's will have the opportunity to work on wood crafts and sewing projects. This may seem to be an unnessary project, but so many senior's have no families and spend their day watching tv or roam aimlessly around their home. We will have our seniors teach each other and share their skills. Our goal is to get these people out of the house and give them a purpose for the day. The second part of the building is for our food pantry. We give out over 3000 lbs. of food each week and we need to expand our present food pantry. We serve over 1200 people food each month through our pantry. With this new building we can buy more bulk products for the pantry.
