6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$500,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Trustees of the Berean Baptist Church of Baltimore City, Inc. for the planning, design, construction, and capital equipping of the Berean Community Outreach Center.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

This bill requires a matching fund that may consist of real property, in-kind contributions, and funds expended prior to the effective date of the Act.

8. Special Provisions

No part of the proceeds of the bonds or the matching funds may be used for sectarian religious purposes.

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

Berean Baptist Church is the oldest African American Church in and serving the Pimlico area. Under the leadership of the Rev. Dr. John A. Lunn, Sr., the goal of the church is and has been a commitment to serve. The church as an active member of the community is committed to the growth and development of all its neighbors, especially those unable to fend for themselves. The mission of the Out Reach Center is to provide programs and services that enhance the development of at-risk community residents to become a positive force for change through community leadership.

10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The Berean Community Out Reach Center, through partnerships with the community and other civic organizations, proposes the development of a community-wide safe haven for at-risk children and adults living in the Upper Park Heights Community in response to overwhelming and challenging living conditions impacting the general well-being of children and their families throughout our inner cities. Congregations throughout Baltimore City are confronted daily with a plethora of problems plaguing many urban cities: high rate of drug abuse, physical and sexual abuse of children and women, substandard living conditions, low reading and test scores, high unemployment in the midst of an increasing number of abandoned buildings. In response to Pimlico's struggling community, Berean developed programs aimed at the revitalization of the family and growth and interdependence through education and job placement. Using a holistic living plan, families will learn to identify signals that can lead to abusive and neglectful situations. Parents and caregivers must first be able to identify the issues that are going on within themselves in order to prevent their entering into or perpetuating a situation of abuse and neglect. Funds are needed to implement training and provide ongoing programs in a safe and adequately-designed-forlearning structure. A structure conducive to learning and taking risks to change one's perspective and mindset is an integral part of our community's success. Partnerships with local hospitals and medical professsionals to provide health related seminars in the center provides access to medical professionals and basic knowledge on how best to provide preventative, first aid, and maintenance care for family members. Classes offering skills in career development, economic and financial empowerment, and community action and responsibility will be available in an effort to complete the inside out transformation. The Out Reach Center will function as a safe haven for learning, a safe haven for children from the unsupervised streets when parents are away at work or school, and a place where adults, children, and neighbors can learn together. The center would provide a neighborhood site where parents working non-traditional hours or have a need for emergency child care can find a safe haven with experienced and trained staff to meet their child care needs. The expected change: The center will teach and support those who are willing to enhance the development of at-risk-community members to become positive forces for change through community leadership.
