The Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Prince George's County Alumnae Chapter is a non-profit

and cultural enrichment. The Prince George's County Delta Alumnae Foundation (PGCDAF) is a								
501-C-3 tax exempt organization which in Fiscal Year 2005 managed approximately \$195,000								
(receipts and dispursements). In 2005 the Sorority's Scholarship Program awarded over \$30,000 in								
scholarships to County high school and college students; sponsored a Reading is Fundamental								
Program; established tutoring and mentoring programs; provided financial support for disaster relief								
to Haiti and the Hurricane Katrina victims; participated in the Walk against Domestic Violence with								
the Family Crisis Center of Prince George's County; sponsored a public forum on Social Security								
and Private Accounts; made a number of donations and contributions and participated in many								
other activities listed in its annual report of 7/1/04-6/30/05.								

10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The Prince George's County Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. is proposing to be the lead organization in moving, restoring and adaptively reusing the Ridgeley Rosenwald School The Deltas are working alongside a multi-agency workgroup to restore this important landmark in the African American education movement in Prince George's County, Maryland. Funds will be used to purchase land, plan for, move, and restore the school.

The school, surrounded by bus parking, currently cannot be seen from Central Avenue. The property to the north, fronting Central Avenue, is currently vacant and the development pressures are extreme. The Deltas have written to the owners of the parcel to initiate discussions about acquiring it. The school would then be moved forward, about 100 yards, onto this parcel where it will have visibility and easy access. The Central Avenue Corridor Sector Plan, currently being developed by the Prince George's County Planning Department, will acknowledge the significance of the school restoration project.

Ultimately, the goal of the Prince George's County Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated is to use two rooms of the school building as a place for community and Delta Sorority meetings, and to turn one of the two original classrooms into a museum displaying furniture, artifacts, and memorabilia that recreate the room according to a unique extant historic photo of the Ridgeley classroom of the 1920's period.

Ridgeley Rosenwald School in Prince George's County was built in 1927 for African American children. Funds for the school construction were raised by the local community and matched by the Julius Rosenwald Fund. Ridgeley is a prototypical Rosenwald elementary school and one of only two still owned by the Prince George's County Public School System. The best example of the nine surviving Rosenwald School structures in Prince George's County, it is considered eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.

Before the school was constructed, classes for elementary students were held in the "colored hall," or "society hall," which stood on the adjoining lot. In 1927, the Board of Education purchased two acres of land from Mary Eliza and Arthur Ridgely (sic), on the south side of Central Avenue a short distance west of Ridgely Church, in the small African-American community that had developed there. Construction began on a two-room schoolhouse similar to those schools (also supported by the Rosenwald fund) designed for Bowie, Lakeland and Laurel.

Although the building has been altered to meet the needs of its current use, it still exhibits many of the prototypical features of Rosenwald schoolhouses of the 1920s. It is also an important landmark in the African-American education movement in Prince George's County, being a prototypical example of the two-room frame schoolhouses built under the Rosenwald program. It exemplifies the cultural, social, educational and historical heritage of the County and its suburban communities.

The Prince George's County Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated, is proposing to be the lead organization in moving, restoring and adaptively reusing the Ridgeley Rosenwald School The Deltas are working alongside a multi-agency workgroup to restore this important landmark in the African American education movement in Prince George's County, Maryland. Funds will be used to purchase the property where the school will be moved.

Since 1967 the school has been used as offices for the Prince George's County Schools bus system. The school, surrounded by bus parking, currently cannot be seen from Central Avenue. The school would be moved forward, about 100 yards, onto this parcel where it will have visibility and easy access.
