Senate Bill 783 (Senator Klausmeier)

Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

State Agencies - Energy Performance Contracting - Water and Wastewater Conservation Projects

This bill adds water and wastewater conservation projects to the definition of energy performance contract as it relates to State procurement law.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill codifies existing practice. The Department of General Services advises that the State already is permitted to enter into energy performance contracts for water and wastewater conservation.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Bill Summary: The bill defines two types of water or wastewater conservation projects in which:

- a person improves the energy or operating efficiency of a building by designing, installing, financing, maintaining, or managing water or wastewater systems, and retains a portion of the energy savings as a fee; or
- a person improves the accuracy of automated, electronic, or remotely controlled systems for calculating billable revenue in exchange for a fixed fee.

For the purpose of procurement law, these types of contracts are included as energy performance contracts.

Current Law: Energy performance contracts are agreements for the provision of energy services, including electricity, heating, ventilation, cooling, steam, or hot water in which a person agrees to improve the energy efficiency of a building in exchange for a portion of the energy savings.
