Compensation to Families of Military Service Members Who Gave Their Lives in the Service of Our Country

This joint resolution urges the President and the U.S. Congress to adequately compensate the families of service members who were killed in the service of the U.S.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Compliance with this joint resolution would not affect State revenues or expenditures.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Background: The U.S. Department of Defense indicates that as of January 26, 2006, 2,240 American service members have been killed in Operation Iraqi Freedom and 255 have been killed in Operation Enduring Freedom. Operation Iraqi Freedom includes casualties that occurred in Iraq, but could include casualties in other areas such as Bahrain, Kuwait, the Persian Gulf, and Saudi Arabia on or after March 19, 2003. Operation Enduring Freedom includes casualties in Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Uzbekistan; as well as other areas such as Guantanamo Bay (Cuba), Turkey, and Yemen.

Additional Information

Prior Introductions: A similar resolution, SJ 4, was introduced during the 2005 legislative session. The resolution received a favorable report by the Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee, and passed the Senate. The resolution was not reported out of the House Rules and Executive Nominations Committee.
