6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$500,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the County Executive and County Council of Howard County for the planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, and capital equipping of an emergency shelter operated by the Grassroots Crisis Intervention Center.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

This bill requires a matching fund that may consist of real property, in-kind contributions, and funds expended prior to the effective date of the Act .

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

Attachment AGrantee: Howard County Government (HCG)

Howard County, a growing county in Central Maryland, geographically located between Washington, DC and Baltimore is home for approximately 273,000 citizens.

As a part of its normal governmental functions, HCG is committed to providing a coordinated network of human services that identifies, anticipates, and addresses needs while enhancing the quality of life for all residents through collaborations and partnerships.

One of the County's specific goals is to ensure that homeless individuals and families have access to appropriate housing and services known as a "Continuum of Care". It is through this continuum that the county's most vulnerable populations receive shelter, case management, and other critical support services.

The proposed project is a collaborative effort between HCG and Grassroots Crisis Intervention Center, Inc. aka "Grassroots". It will directly support the stated goal and related activity by increasing the shelter and service capacity of Grassroots, which is the County's only emergency shelter and is considered to be the County's "gateway" to accessing homeless services.

Delegation Support:

Delegate Shane Pendergrass supports the Grassroots Crisis Intervention Center Building Renovation Project.

Reason for the project, justification and importance:

The proposed project site is located in Columbia, Maryland. The existing facility, owned by HCG and leased by Grassroots, serves a number of purposes. It is used as the administrative office for the organization, it provides 32 beds for sheltering of homeless families and men, and provides limited offices for counseling and a 24-hour crisis operation. Services provided for residents include short-term housing, meals, counseling and case management, job-readiness program and service coordination and referral.

In FY2004, approximately 1,000 people had a need annually for some type of assistance with short-term housing. There were 2,100 shelter requests made to Grassroots last year. There has been an increase from 381 to 1,000 walk-in requests for crisis intervention services from FY1998-2004. In 2004 48 people spent 59 nights in the Grassroots lobby. In FY2005, the mobile crisis team is projected to respond to almost twice the 179 cases served in FY2004.

These numbers serve in part as justification for the need to increase the shelter's capacity.

The facility is no longer adequate to serve the needs of this growing population, as over 200 people per month are turned away.

The high volume of usage has caused the facility to be in an ongoing state of disrepair, and inadequate space in the kitchen area is not sufficient food storage, food preparation, serving and eating; and the length of stay of shelter residents, now averaging over nine months, has significantly diminished the number of persons who can be served annually.

Attachment BAlternative Funding Sources:

Howard County's contribution:

The project's budget for construction only, is \$4,800,000. HCG commitment of Capital funds is over 30%. Grassroots currently has pledge letters bringing that total to well over 38%, and has just begun their fund-raising campaign.

Additional Private Funds:

All design costs are paid by private funding received and managed by Grassroots.

HCG is committed to this project, and has contributed both hard and soft matches recapped in the following to meet the goals described in the narrative.

Hard Match: Included in our 2006/2007Capital Improvement Program is \$1,500,000 in construction funding

Soft Match: County owned Land of 1.11 acres the value is in the process of being evaluated and, a building lease in which an assessment will be completed in the next 60 days of the current market value.

Here's how we would allocate the \$500,000 grant of funds from the State:

Current construction plans include increasing square footage of the building from 8,920, to an increased size of 22,000 square feet. This will include parking for 30 vehicles.

The plans increase the number of beds from 32 to 55.

In addition to simply increasing size to accommodate more overnight stay, there are also plans to increase and better manage space dedicated to rehabilitation services and outreach. Add a service kitchen.
