#### FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 497 Judiciary (Charles County Delegation)

### Criminal Procedure - Money as Contraband - Premises Used for Prostitution

This bill provides that money is *prima facie* contraband if a law enforcement officer seizes it in connection with an arrest for using commercial or residential premises for prostitution.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. The change would not materially affect governmental operations or expenditures.

**Local Effect:** None – see above.

Small Business Effect: None.

## **Analysis**

**Current Law:** Money is *prima facie* contraband if a law enforcement officer seizes it in connection with an arrest for:

- unlawfully playing or operating a bookmaking scheme;
- unlawfully betting on a horse race, athletic event, lottery, or game; or
- using an unlawful gaming table or gaming device.

All rights in, title to, and interest in money seized shall immediately vest in and to:

- the county or the municipal corporation, if the money is seized by the police of a local government; or
- the State, if the money is seized by a State authority.

The Police Department of Baltimore City is not a State authority for this purpose.

**Prior Introductions:** HB 713 of 2005, an identical bill, received a hearing in the House Judiciary Committee, but was later withdrawn.
