6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt to serve as a grant to the Board of Governors of the Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum, Inc., for the planning, design, construction, repair, and capital equipping of improvements to the Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum, including the replacement of the bulkhead along the perimeter of the Museum campus.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

The grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund. No part of the matching fund may consist of in kind contributions or funds expended prior to the effective date of the Act. The fund may consist of real property.

8. Special Provisions

None.

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

The Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum is dedicated to furthering an interest in, understanding of, and appreciation for the culture and maritime heritage of the Chesapeake Bay and its environs. To fulfill that mission, the Museum strives to be a premier museum, excelling in communicating to the public the history and culture of the Chesapeake Bay, one of America's major maritime regions. Taking a broad, multidisciplinary approach to the maritime history of the region, the Museum probes the intersections of nature and culture, and Chesapeake and humankind, both in the past and in the present.

Founded in 1965, the Museum is today the leading maritime museum focusing on the Chesapeake Bay. With visitor experience as a top priority, the Museum attracts 70,000 visitors a year to its 18-acre waterfront campus on St. Michaels harbor. Featuring the nation's most complete collection of Chesapeake Bay artifacts, visual arts, and indigenous watercraft in engaging interpretive exhibitions and public programs, the Museum promotes inquiry and understanding of the Chesapeake region and its people. Through its Center for Chesapeake Studies, the Museum conducts and promotes regional folklife and historical research, translating this into exhibits, programs, and collections that fill 13 exhibit buildings, a working boatyard, a state-of-the-art collection storage building, and a well-regarded maritime library. With a staff of 50, nearly 7000 members, and almost 300 active volunteers, the Museum is one of the most important cultural institutions in the region.

10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The Museum grounds were swamped by the storm surge from Hurricane Isabel in 2003. The severe flooding accelerated the need for replacement of the 1000-ft bulkhead (orginally built in the 1970s) that frames the perimeter of the Museum's campus. Not only is the bulkhead hazardous for visitors arriving by boat, but it is also a safety concern for Museum visitors strolling the water's edge. Despite the Museum's best efforts, sections of the ground are continuously washed away, leaving treacherous holes, and the wood along the bulkhead is split and rotted.
