6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt to serve as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Disabled Veterans' LIFE Memorial Foundation, Inc. for the design, construction, and capital equipping of the American Veterans Disabled for Life Memorial to be located adjacent to the National Mall in the District of Columbia.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

The bill requires a standard match.

8. Special Provisions

None.

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

The Disabled Veterans' LIFE Memorial Foundation (DVLMF) was incorporated as a nonprofit corporation in the District of Columbia in May 1998. The DVLMF is an IRS-designated 501(c)(3) organization. Its purposes are to create a national memorial on federal lands in the District of Columbia and its environs to honor disabled American veterans who have served in the Armed Forces of the United States, to inform and educate the general public about disabled veterans related activities, and to accomplish all other purposes authorized by law.

10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

Congress supported the creation of the American Veterans Disabled for Life Memorial with the passage of Public Law 106-348, signed by President Clinton in 2000. In August 2001, a site adjacent to the National Mall at Second Street and Washington Avenue within direct sight of the U.S. Capitol was selected and approved by the National Capital Planning Commission and the Commission of Fine Arts. During 2002 a national invitational competition was held to choose a design for the memorial. Michael Vergason Landscape Architects, of Alexandria, Virginia was selected. The Commission of Fine Arts and the National Capital Planning Commission approved an initial design concept for the memorial in 2004. The memorial will restore the historic integrity of a site that is neither visually attractive nor pedestrian-friendly at present. As a key landmark at the northern boundary of the South Capitol Street revitalization project, the memorial will likely serve as an attractive and secure gateway to and from the National Mall and Capitol for official processions.

The memorial is to be an enduring monument that commemorates the sacrifice and dedication of disabled American veterans from all brenches of the Armed Service through out America's history, ensuring that they are always remembered for having placed their lives and bodies in harm's way, and who spend each day living with a deep and permanent reminder of their willing sacrifice to protect the United States of America.
