Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$1,000,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the YMCA of Central Maryland, Inc. for the planning, design, construction, and capital equipping of the Towson Family Branch YMCA.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

This bill requires a standard match.

8. Special Provisions

No part of the proceeds of the bonds or the matching funds may be used for sectarian religious purposes.

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

The YMCA of Central Maryland is a 501(c)(3) human service organization dedicated to developing the full potential of every individual through programs that build healthy spirit, mind and body for all. These programs include childcare, after school programs, day and resident camp, teen leadership development, youth and interactive family programs, tutoring, mentoring, health education and wellness and programs for older adults and those with special needs. At the Y, prevention is the best solution.

The Y is the largest provider of licensed childcare in the state of Maryland. The Towson Family Branch YMCA is an integral part of this program, providing licensed childcare to more than 300 youngsters and their families each day.

The current aged facility (construction from the 1920s and 1960s) is energy inefficient. Maintenance and operating expenses are estimated to be at least twenty per cent higher than they would be in a new facility. The Towson YMCA is unable to expand youth sports programs because of the lack of indoor space. Currently our gymnasium is programmed from open to close with classes for adults such as aerobics and spinning. By using the most contemporary strategies for designing "flexible" and "multi-purpose" recreation space, the YMCA will be better able to adapt to changing health and recreation markets in the future. A new facility would provide meeting and conference room space for local businesses and community associations.

Through the design of integrated energy management systems, the YMCA will achieve a 15%-20% reduction in annual energy costs. These savings will be able to directly impact the community by being invested in programs and activities for the benefit of the children, families and seniors served by the YMCA.

10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

Design, construct and equip a 54,000 square foot facility in Towson Maryland for the Towson Family Branch of the YMCA of Central Maryland. The new and expanded facility and programs will enable us to focus on serving thousands of additional families, children, teens, and seniors in our community.

The current facility is more than 50 years old. The outdated design and infrastructure along with the increased population growth means that we turn away children, families and community groups because the space either is limited or unavailable. Families who need summer camps put their youngsters on a waiting list. Seniors and adults endure long waiting lines. Teens are frustrated because they do not have free gym time to play ball or enjoy other activities.

The facility requires constant and costly maintenance. The new facility will have two swimming pools, a gymnasium, wellness center, locker rooms, multipurpose rooms and a teen/senior center.

The Towson Branch YMCA currently serves more than 7,800 members. Each and every one will benefit from an improved facility. And, once the facility is complete, it is anticipated that the branch will serve nearly double that number of members (15,000).
