9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)				
<p>The City of Gaithersburg was incorporated under a charter of the Maryland General Assembly on April 5, 1878 as a body politic endowed with legislative powers to administer local and internal government affairs within the corporate limits. Pursuant to Article 11E of the Constitution of Maryland, the City of Gaithersburg is empowered as a branch of the State Government to carry out municipal functions thorough Council Manager form of government. Accordingly, the Mayor and City Council have adopted the City Code which is comprised of laws to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the 58,091 residents of Gaithersburg. Based on the 2004 Census update released in July 2005, Gaithersburg is the second largest municipality in the State.</p>				
10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)				
<p>The City is nearing completion of its west-side youth center, which will be ready for after-school activities and camp programs this spring. The City's other youth center, located on East Diamond Avenue in Olde Towne Gaithersburg, serves approximately 85 youth each day, ranging in age from 11 - 14. Arts and crafts activities, sports and games, as well as after-school tutoring and homework programs are provided each day from 3:00 pm to 6:00. Based on the 2000 Census, Olde Towne Gaithersburg has the largest percent of low-moderate income households in the City, and most of these youth would return to empty apartments after school if this Center were not available. Because activities at the Center will be expanded to include additional programs for high-school students, the new building will be approximately twice the size of the existing facility. Additionally, the upcoming revitalization of Olde Towne include multiple opportunities for redevelopment of this site.</p>
