6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$145,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the United Way of Calvert County, Inc. for the expansion of the parking lot and the repair, renovation, reconstruction, and capital equipping of the environmental cleanup of the United Way building.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

This bill requires a matching fund which may consist of real property, in kind contributions, and funds expended prior to the date of the act.

8. Special Provisions

None.

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

The United Way of Calvert County (UWCC) was incorporated in 1980 to respond to the human service needs of Calvert County residents. The UWCC is an independent, separately incorporated organization governed by local volunteers who serve only Calvert County and whose mission today is to engage the community in making a meaningful difference to improve people's lives. UWCC funds 36 local agencies and programs that help community members of all ages by providing basic needs, strengthening families, supporting the disabled, promoting self sufficiency, and investing in our children. UWCC is an impact-driven organization touching the lives of over 35,000 people in Calvert County. To more efficiently and effectively meet the rapidly growing needs of the community, UWCC purchased a community building located in Prince Frederick in 1997. The United Way House is used as central headquarters for the United Way offices and has become home to six agencies and programs and is used by numerous organizations for meetings, communication and support services. The UWCC House also shares the use of equipment and technology with other local agencies that otherwise would not be able to afford these services. In 1997 the UWCC pursued and opened the first Volunteer Resource Center (VRC) in Southern Maryland. The VRC is located within the United Way House to link volunteers to local community agencies throughout Calvert County and provides training and resources for volunteers and agencies. The VRC has played a major role in recruiting community emergency response volunteers to assist in times of community disasters. The United Way VRC works in partnership with the State in hosting an Americorps VISTA Volunteer at the United Way House working closing with the Calvert community. Also in 1998 UWCC began intensive work in the area of early childhood development and the creation of a Success By 6 Initiative. The Goal of the UWCC Success By 6® Initiative is to bring business and community partners together to work towards helping all children in Calvert County enter school ready to learn and be successful for life. In just five years, with a focus on access to services and early literacy, the percentage of children entering school ready to learn increased from 43% to 63%. What really matter are the lives we change, the communities we impact--the bottom-line results.

10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

When the United Way House was purchased it was already 47 years old. With time and help from the community, UWCC has taken care of minor repairs that have occurred in the last 9 years. However, in the recent years, the United Way House has had major issues affecting the safety and health of employees and community members. Last year an employee reported being sick due to possible mold accumulation around her working space. After an intensive environmental assessment of the building, it was concluded that the malfunction of the air-conditioning caused build up of mold spores. In order to address the problem, a full mold remediation and removal and replacement of flooring, carpet, and bathroom, was done to the basement of the United Way House. As a result, not only the UWCC acquired tremendous expenses, but also had to remove an entire program from its location for over 3 months causing staff and clients hardships. In addition, the windows, doors and roof of the house are deteriorating and lacking the necessary insulation to keep the house warm. As a result, money that could be going towards addressing community needs is being used to pay expensive electric bills. As community needs grows, so does the services provided by UWCC agencies and programs. The funds allocated to UWCC agencies help serve over 35,000 people. Every dollar counts in making a difference of a lifetime. Unfortunately, every month UWCC spends \$1,495 on a house mortgage, totaling 17,940 a year. If such amount were allocated to programs, they would have a much greater impact in addressing our community critical needs. In addition, to more efficiently and effectively meeting the rapidly growing needs of our community; UWCC must expand its parking lot. Last year alone over 3,000 people came to the United Way House for information, services and volunteer opportunities. The United Way House is needed for the UWCC to continue to create lasting changes in the lives of Calvert County residents.
