The Lake Whetstone Park has been a major regional draw, especially for families for almost 40 years and is the first environmentally focused dedicated recreation area developed in Montgomery Village uniquely combining necessary storm water management through the creation of the lake and preserving a large scale natural habitat in the heart of the community offering a vast array of family oriented recreation opportunities including boating, fishing, nature study, walking paths, picnicking, bird watching, etc. The Boat House and activities deck were originally conceived to be the focal point for programs and activities related to the park at a time when it was foreseen that the community's population would be 25,000 and the region's 100,000 but, in 2006, the community population is 40,000 and the region's is estimated to be double. There has also been a marked shift in the past decade in the diversity of the community and region's population. To continue to be a major positive recreation focal point for the community and region, it is imperative to upgrade the Boat House from seasonal to four season, to improve it to be able to handle modest programs and activities indoors, and to rebuild and enhance the attendant activities deck waterside to support expanded programs and services. There has been no major capital improvement at the site since built 40 years ago. The Lake Whetstone Park is located adjacent to a four lane county road that links to major regional arterials including Mid County Highway and I-270 and is easily accessible and visible, and it is the primary naturally preserve recreation center in Montgomery Village.
