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6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State debt to serve as a grant to the Board of Directors of Kennedy Krieger Children's Hospital for the planning, design, renovation, expansion, repair, construction, and capital equipping of the Spinal Cord Injury Recovery Program.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

The grantee must provide and expend a matching fund. No part of the fund may consist of real property or in kind contributions. The fund may consist of funds expended prior to the effective date of the Act.

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

Kennedy Krieger Children's Hospital is an internationally recognized resource center dedicated to improving the lives of children and adolescents with disorders of the brain. Patient care programs include more than 20 outpatient clinics, 70 beds in three inpatient units (special pediatric and rehabilitation) and various home- and community-based programs representing 14 disciplines. Each focuses on building patient independence and strengthening participation in home, school and community life. The spinal cord injury recovery program, the first of its kind dedicated to children, focuses on meeting the comprehensive physical disabilities needs of Kennedy Krieger's patient population, i.e., children with developmental disabilities and related neurological disorders.

10. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

Kennedy Krieger Children's Hospital is planning a phased expansion of its clinical outpatient programs in a new 100,000 square foot facility to be constructed in the 800 block of North Broadway in East Baltimore. Part of that new center, the spinal cord injury recovery program is designed to help children experiencing paralysis improve health and optimize recovery of function. Paralysis in children may occur as a result of accident, stroke, tumor, birth defects or other causes. Although patients in the immediate, acute phases of rehabilitation are served, the project targets long-term outpatient therapy regimens designed to be followed at home. Over a period of time, parents and caregivers are trained in delivering these therapies to their injured child or family member. The outpatient treatment team includes neurology, physical medicine and rehabilitation, nursing, physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, audiology and other related rehabilitation disciplines. Potential applications of the new treatments extend beyond spinal cord injuries and include other physical disabilities such as cerebral palsy and spina bifida.

Historically, Kennedy Krieger has always served children with spinal cord injuries, including 80% of such children living in Maryland. The expanded spinal cord injury recovery program is becoming a program of national significance. A newly recruited director and his team of rehabilitation specialists coupled with new treatment modalities are expected to increase pediatric referrals from out-of-state and out-of-country. These new treatment approaches will be provided in new state-of-the-art space with state-of-the-art equipment. The project will occupy approximately 22,000 square feet or 23% of the new center.
