6. Purpose of Bill				
Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$250,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Trustees of Baltimore Clayworks, Inc. for the planning, design, construction, capital equipping, and installation of an elevator and community and multipurpose rooms, and the repair, renovation, and reconstruction of upgrades to the plumbing, electrical, and roofing systems.				
7. Matching Fund Requirements				
This bill requires a matching fund that may consist of in-kind contributions. No part of the fund may consist of real property or funds expended prior to the effective date of the Act.				
8. Special Provisions				
The bill requires the grantee to convey to the Maryland Historical Trust a perpetual preservation easement to the extent of its interest in the property.				
9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)				
<p>Baltimore Clayworks is Maryland's only nonprofit cultural institution dedicated solely to the ceramic arts. Founded in 1980 by a collective of nine ceramic artists, it has evolved into a mid-sized arts center possessing a national reputation for artistic excellence, artists' support and community involvement. The Clayworks community strives daily to fulfill the organization's mission: to develop, promote and sustain an artist-centered community that provides outstanding educational, artistic and collaborative programs in the ceramic arts. Clayworks undertakes the following programs and activities in support of its mission:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Supports a school for the ceramic arts where in 2005, 805 young people and adults participated in hands-on clay classes at all skill levels and on a variety of topics. • Provides studio space for 13 professional clay artists who are peer juried for residency. • Presents 10 exhibitions featuring work of professional ceramic artists year-round, free to the public. • Houses specialized equipment for ceramics, including electric, gas and woodfiring kilns and potters' wheels and provides unaffiliated artists and organizations access to these resources. • Provides sustained hands-on clay and arts activities for young people and adults living in underserved neighborhoods of greater Baltimore. 700 individuals participated in community arts classes in 2005.

<p>Renovation of an historic (1889) convent given to Baltimore Clayworks in 1999. Presently, the biggest obstacle to the future growth and viability of Baltimore Clayworks is its ability to meet the needs of artists, students and the community in an out-dated and inaccessible physical plant. The building project for which we are seeking support will physically:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Upgrade our gallery and administrative offices through moderization of facilities and systems * Enlarge and improve our meeting space * Provide access to all levels of the gallery/office building via elevator* * Add cohesive outdoor public space to our campus. <p>With the planned addition and renovations to our current facilities, the organization aims to enhance Clayworks' capacity to provide outstanding artistic programs both on and offsite. The renovation and modernization of the Gallery Building is critical to the community, the artists, the Board and the staff.</p>
