A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2006 – Anne Arundel County –**
3 **Women’s Club of Linthicum Heights**

4 FOR the purpose of amending the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2006
5 to remove a requirement that the Board of Directors of the Women’s Club of
6 Linthicum Heights, Inc. provide and expend a matching fund; and making this
7 Act an emergency measure.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
9 Chapter 46 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2006
10 Section 1(3) ZA02 Item (P)

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (P) Women’s Club of Linthicum Heights. Provide a grant
2 [equal to the lesser of (i)] ~~OF~~ \$50,000 [or (ii) the amount
3 of the matching fund provided,] to the Board of
4 Directors of the Women’s Club of Linthicum Heights,
5 Inc. for the construction, repair, renovation,
6 reconstruction, and capital equipping of the Women’s
7 Club meeting facility, located in Linthicum Heights,
8 subject to a requirement that the grantee grant and
9 convey a historic easement to the Maryland Historical
10 Trust. [Notwithstanding Section 1(5) of this Act, the
11 matching fund may consist of real property, in kind
12 contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective
13 date of this Act] (Anne Arundel County)..... 50,000

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
15 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,
16 has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
17 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from
18 the date it is enacted.
