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1 2 3	(3) The Task Force may not make recommendations regarding mandatory course content or curricular materials for the University System of Maryland or public schools.
4 5	(g) The Task Force shall submit to the Governor and, in accordance with $\$ 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly:
6	(1) an interim report on or before March 1, 2007; and
7	(2) a final report on or before September 1, 2008.
8	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2007 .
