#### 1 AN ACT concerning

### **Oral Health Safety Net Program**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Oral Health Safety Net Program in the Office of 4 Oral Health in the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; providing for the 5 purpose of the Program; requiring the Office to solicit and award certain grants, 6 subject to the State budget; requiring the Office to oversee the operation of the 7 Program; requiring the Office to conduct a certain annual evaluation of the 8 Program; requiring the Office to contract with a certain individual, subject to 9 the State budget; requiring the Office to provide certain education courses, 10 subject to the State budget; requiring the Office to submit a certain report to the Governor and to the General Assembly on or before a certain date; declaring the 11 12 intent of the General Assembly; requiring the Department to conduct a certain survey; defining a certain term; providing for the termination of this Act; and 13 generally relating to oral health for underserved populations in the State. 14

1 WHEREAS, While almost 44% of HealthChoice recipients make at least one 2 dental visit each year, only 14% of HealthChoice recipients receive restorative dental 3 care; and

WHEREAS, Restorative treatment services should be increased to better accommodate the needs of the HealthChoice population and other underserved populations; now, therefore,

# THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE SHALL CONDUCT A STATEWIDE FOLLOW-UP SURVEY ON OR BEFORE JUNE 1, 2011, CONCERNING THE ORAL HEALTH STATUS OF SCHOOL CHILDREN IN THE STATE.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of 7 September 30, 2011, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act 8 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
