1 AN ACT concerning

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Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of
 2007, and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2000, 2001, 2003,
 2004, 2005, and 2006

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of Eight Hundred Six Million, Seven Hundred Ninety-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$806,799,000) Eight Hundred Seventeen Million, Three Hundred Seventy–Five Thousand Dollars (\$817,375,000), the proceeds to be used, subject to certain restrictions, for certain necessary building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to the requirement that certain grantees provide and expend certain matching funds by certain dates; stating the intent of the General Assembly that funds be provided for certain projects for certain fiscal years; requiring the Interagency Committee on School Construction to allocate certain funds available for public school construction projects in a certain manner and to include certain funds in certain allocations; providing certain allocations made by the Interagency Committee are not subject to approval by the Board of Public Works; requiring that certain amounts approved for public school construction projects be allocated to certain counties; requiring that certain additional funds be provided to certain counties to be expended for certain public school construction projects subject to certain priority; providing that certain school construction funds may be applied to certain other projects or reverted to a certain fund under certain circumstances; authorizing the Interagency Committee to allocate certain additional funds in a certain manner after certain notice to the presiding officers of the General Assembly; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loans; authorizing

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That:
- 20 The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as 21the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2007 in the total principal amount 22of \$806,799,000 \$817,375,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and 23 24delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 25 26 through 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code. 27
- 28 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a single issue of bonds under Section 8–122 of the State Finance and 30 Procurement Article.
- 31 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the 32 Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, 33 and delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and 34 then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by 35 the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable 36 architects' and engineers' fees:

  9 5–101 of the Tax General Article, if the alcoholic beverage is sold for consumption off
  10 the premises.
- 11 (4) "Convention center facility" means a convention center of at least 12 150,000 net square feet, that is used for the holding of conventions, trade shows, 13 meetings, displays, entertainment shows, or similar events but does not have lodging 14 facilities.
- 15 (5) "Resort area" means any portion or portions of a county, as specified by the county commissioners of the county, that:
- 17 <u>(i)</u> By reason of natural, scenic, or man-made attractions or 18 development, has or have an unusual influx of visitors, sojourners, and temporary 19 residents; and
- 20 <u>(ii)</u> By reason of the influx requires municipal services in unusual 21 number or magnitude.
- 22 (6) "Taxable price" has the meaning stated in § 11–101 of the Tax 23 General Article.
- 24 (b) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the county commissioners of a code county, by public local law, may impose a tax on the sale of food and beverages in a resort area in the county for the sole purpose of providing revenues to pay the principal and interest on bonds issued relating to the construction, reconstruction, repair, renovation, or equipping of a convention center facility in the resort area. The total principal amount of the bonds issued by the local governing body for this purpose may not exceed [\$15,000,000] \$20,000,000.
- SECTION 14. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding § 5–302(e) of the Education Article or any other provision of law, for fiscal year 2009, the Board of Public Works may not, before May 1, 2008, approve public school construction projects that comprise more than 75% of the preliminary school construction allocation recommended by the Governor as required in § 8–113 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
