- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
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## Article 20C – Mid–Shore Regional Council

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1 (a) The membership of the Council consists of the following members from 2 Caroline, Dorchester, and Talbot counties: 3 [Nine] SIX COUNCILMEMBERS OR commissioners, [three] TWO (1)from each county, appointed by their respective county governing bodies as voting 4 5 members: 6 (2)Three county administrators, one from each county as nonvoting ex 7 officio members: Three municipal elected officials, one from each county, 8 (i) (3)9 appointed by their respective municipal corporations as voting members; or 10 (ii) If the municipal corporations located in a county are unable to choose a municipal elected official within a reasonable period of time, the Eastern 11 Shore Municipal Association shall appoint an elected municipal official to represent 12 13 the municipal corporation; 14 Members of the General Assembly representing the region who (4)have a majority of their legislative district in the region as voting ex officio members; 15 16 (5)Members of the General Assembly representing the region who do not have a majority of their legislative district in the region as nonvoting ex officio 17 18 members; and 19 The other **COUNCILMEMBERS OR** commissioners as nonvoting ex (6) 20 officio members. 21 A voting COUNCILMEMBER OR commissioner listed under (b) (1)22 subsection (a)(1) of this section may designate another COUNCILMEMBER OR commissioner or county administrator representing the same county to vote by proxy 23 on behalf of the voting COUNCILMEMBER OR commissioner when the voting 24 COUNCILMEMBER OR commissioner is absent from a meeting. 25 26 (2)A voting COUNCILMEMBER OR commissioner listed under subsection (a)(1) of this section shall inform the council executive director, in advance, 27 of which other council members the voting COUNCILMEMBER OR commissioner 28 29 designates to cast a proxy vote on behalf of the voting COUNCILMEMBER OR

30 commissioner.

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(c) The bylaws of the Council may provide for additional private citizen OR
 PUBLIC membership on the Council.
