- (8) PERFORM OTHER DUTIES ASSIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR.

18 (I) IN COORDINATION WITH STATE AGENCIES, THE SUBCABINET SHALL 19 EVALUATE AND REPORT ANNUALLY TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE 20 WITH § 2–1246 OF THIS ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON STATE 21 ACTION TO SUPPORT THE MISSION OF MILITARY INSTALLATIONS LOCATED IN 22 THE STATE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 June 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and 7 months and, at the
 end of December 31, 2011, with no further action required by the General Assembly,
 this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
