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- 12 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION, "CONSUMER" MEANS AN ACTUAL OR

- 17 **(B)** THIS SECTION IS INTENDED TO PROVIDE MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR PROTECTION OF CONSUMERS IN THE STATE.
- 19 (C) (1) TO THE EXTENT THAT A VIOLATION OF ANY PROVISION OF
 20 THIS TITLE AFFECTS A CONSUMER, THAT VIOLATION SHALL BE WITHIN THE

6	OF THE CLERK OF THE COURT IN THE COUNTY WHERE THE DEVELOPMENT IS
7	LOCATED.
