1 AN ACT concerning

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Ethics - Complaints - Copy to Legislator

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Joint Ethics Committee to provide a copy of a certain
 complaint to the legislator who is the subject of the complaint; requiring the
 Joint Ethics Committee to redact the name of the complainant and other
 identifying information from a certain complaint; and generally relating to
 complaints filed with the Joint Ethics Committee.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – State Government

16 15–515.

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(a) A complaint alleging that a member of the General Assembly may have
violated standards of ethical conduct, including § 2–108 of this article, may be filed
with the Joint Ethics Committee by:

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1 (1) a written statement from any person, accompanied by an affidavit 2 setting forth the facts upon which the statement is based;

3 (2) motion of a majority of the membership of the Joint Ethics 4 Committee; or

5 (3) referral of a matter to the Joint Ethics Committee by a presiding 6 officer of the General Assembly as provided in § 2–706(a)(5) of this article.

7 (b) (1) **(I)** The Joint Ethics Committee shall provide a copy of each 8 complaint filed under subsection (a) of this section to the presiding officer of the house 9 of the legislator who is the subject of the complaint.

10 [(2)] (II) Based on the information contained in a complaint provided 11 to a presiding officer under [paragraph (1)] SUBPARAGRAPH (I) of this [subsection] 12 PARAGRAPH, if a presiding officer determines that it is inappropriate for a Joint 13 Ethics Committee member from that house to consider a particular matter, the 14 presiding officer shall appoint a substitute member of the Joint Ethics Committee for 15 the purposes of consideration of the matter.

16 (2) (I) THE JOINT ETHICS COMMITTEE SHALL PROVIDE A 17 COPY OF A COMPLAINT FILED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION TO THE 18 LEGISLATOR WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF THE COMPLAINT.

(II) PRIOR TO PROVIDING A COPY OF THE COMPLAINT TO
 THE LEGISLATOR UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE JOINT
 ETHICS COMMITTEE SHALL REDACT THE NAME OF THE COMPLAINANT AND ANY
 OTHER INFORMATION THAT IDENTIFIES THE COMPLAINANT.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 24 October 1, 2007.
