## Sexual Offenders - Evaluation Before Sentencing

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a court, unless there is a certain waiver, before sentencing a certain defendant, to order that the defendant submit to a 4 5 presentence investigation conducted by the Division of Parole and Probation and a mental health evaluation conducted by a certain individual employed or 6 7 engaged by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; requiring a court to 8 consider the presentence investigation and mental health evaluation when sentencing the defendant; and generally relating to evaluation and sentencing 9 10 of sexual offenders.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (A) UNLESS WAIVED BY THE STATE'S ATTORNEY AND DEFENSE 21 COUNSEL, BEFORE SENTENCING A DEFENDANT WHO HAS BEEN CONVICTED OF A

- 2 11-704 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE COURT SHALL ORDER THE DEFENDANT TO
- 3 **SUBMIT TO:**
- 4 (1) A PRESENTENCE INVESTIGATION CONDUCTED BY THE 5 DIVISION OF PAROLE AND PROBATION; AND
- 6 (2) A MENTAL HEALTH ASSESSMENT, INCLUDING WHETHER THE
  7 DEFENDANT IS A DANGER TO SELF OR OTHERS, CONDUCTED BY A QUALIFIED
- 8 MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYED OR ENGAGED BY THE
- 9 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE.
- 10 **(B)** THE COURT SHALL CONSIDER THE PRESENTENCE INVESTIGATION AND MENTAL HEALTH EVALUATION WHEN SENTENCING THE DEFENDANT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2007.
