A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Correctional Officers' Retirement System – Disability Retirement**

3 FOR the purpose of exempting from certain earnings limitations and certain
4 reemployment restrictions certain retirees of the Correctional Officers'
5 Retirement System; and generally relating to retirees of the Correctional
6 Officers' Retirement System receiving disability retirement allowances.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
8 Article – State Personnel and Pensions
9 Section 29–115 and 29–116
10 Annotated Code of Maryland

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – State Personnel and Pensions**

15 29–115.

16 (a) (1) This section applies only to a disability retiree who is not eligible to
17 receive a normal service retirement.

18 (2) This section does not apply to a disability retiree who is:

19 (i) a retiree of:

- 1 1. the State Police Retirement System;
- 2 2. the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System;
- 3 3. the local fire and police system; [or]
- 4 4. the Employees' Retirement System or the Employees'
- 5 Pension System, if at the time of retirement the retiree was a law enforcement officer
- 6 for a participating employer under § 26–201(a) of this article; **OR**

7 **5. THE CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS' RETIREMENT**
 8 **SYSTEM;** and

9 (ii) reemployed by a participating employer in any position
 10 other than a probationary status law enforcement officer, a law enforcement officer, or
 11 chief, as defined in § 3–101 of the Public Safety Article.

12 (b) (1) (i) The Board of Trustees shall, after giving notice, temporarily
 13 suspend the retiree's allowance if the retiree:

14 1. began receiving a disability retirement allowance on
 15 or after July 1, 1998; and

16 2. is employed by a participating employer at an annual
 17 compensation that is at least equal to the retiree's average final compensation at
 18 retirement.

19 (ii) A temporary suspension under this subsection shall begin as
 20 of the date the retiree is reemployed by a participating employer under subparagraph
 21 (i)2 of this paragraph.

22 (2) A retiree whose allowance is temporarily suspended under this
 23 subsection is not subject to a reduction as provided in § 29–116 of this subtitle during
 24 the period of employment by a participating employer.

25 (3) Upon receiving satisfactory documentation that the retiree is no
 26 longer employed by a participating employer, the Board of Trustees shall reinstate the
 27 retiree's allowance with accumulated cost-of-living adjustments from the date the
 28 allowance was temporarily suspended.

1 (4) The retiree's allowance will be reinstated on the first day of the
2 month following the month in which the retiree ceased employment with the
3 participating employer.

4 (c) If the retiree refuses to provide the information, the Board of Trustees
5 shall suspend the retiree's allowance until the information is provided.

7 (a) This section does not apply to a retiree who is:

8 (1) a retiree of:

9 (i) the State Police Retirement System;

10 (ii) the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System;

11 (iii) the local fire and police system; [or]

12 (iv) the Employees' Retirement System or the Employees'
13 Pension System, if at the time of retirement the retiree was a law enforcement officer
14 for a participating employer under § 26–201(a) of this article; **OR**

15 **(v) THE CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM;**

16 and

17 (2) reemployed by a participating employer in any position other than
18 a probationary status law enforcement officer, a law enforcement officer, or chief, as
19 defined in § 3–101 of the Public Safety Article.

20 (b) The Board of Trustees shall reduce the pension of a retiree on ordinary
21 disability if:

22 (1) the retiree is under normal retirement age;

23 (2) the medical board certifies in a report to the Board of Trustees that
24 the retiree is employed by a participating employer at an annual compensation that is
25 greater than the difference between:

26 (i) the retiree's retirement allowance at retirement; and

27 (ii) the retiree's average final compensation plus \$5,000;

1 (3) the Board of Trustees agrees with the medical board's report; and

2 (4) the retiree's allowance has not been temporarily suspended as
3 provided in § 29-115 of this subtitle.

4 (c) The Board of Trustees shall reduce the pension of a retiree who has been
5 receiving an ordinary disability retirement allowance for:

6 (1) less than 10 years, by \$1 for every \$2 that the retiree's current
7 compensation exceeds the limit under subsection (b) of this section; or

8 (2) at least 10 years, by \$1 for every \$5 that the retiree's current
9 compensation exceeds the limit under subsection (b) of this section.

10 (d) The pension to be reduced under this section is the pension at retirement
11 without any cost-of-living adjustment.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 July 1, 2007.
