Nonprofit Health Service Plans – Boards of Directors – Term Limits and Compensation

4 FOR the purpose of altering the number of terms and the total number of years that 5 may be served by a member of the board of directors of a nonprofit health 6 service plan; altering the amount and type of compensation that may be 7 received by a board member; requiring the Maryland Insurance Commissioner 8 to make a certain review in a certain manner about the amount of compensation 9 to be paid to board members; requiring the Commissioner to submit a certain 10 report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date each year; altering the requirement that a certain corporation report certain 11 information to the Commissioner; and generally relating to the boards of 12 directors of nonprofit health service plans. 13
