CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Family Law – Paternity – Dependent Disabled Child**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing that a proceeding to establish paternity of a child who
4 is dependent on a parent because of a mental or physical infirmity may be
5 begun at any time before ~~or after~~ the child's ~~eighteenth~~ twenty-first birthday;
6 and generally relating to paternity of a disabled child.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Family Law**

15 5–1006.

1 (a) **[A] EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS**
2 **SECTION, A** proceeding to establish paternity of a child under this subtitle may be
3 begun at any time before the child's eighteenth birthday.

4 (b) A paternity proceeding under this subtitle may be begun during
5 pregnancy.

6 (c) A complaint under this subtitle is not barred because the child born out of
7 wedlock was conceived or born outside this State.

8 **(D) A PROCEEDING TO ESTABLISH PATERNITY OF A CHILD WHO IS**
9 **DEPENDENT ON A PARENT BECAUSE OF A MENTAL OR PHYSICAL INFIRMITY MAY**
10 **BE BEGUN AT ANY TIME BEFORE ~~OR AFTER~~ THE CHILD'S ~~EIGHTEENTH~~**
11 **TWENTY-FIRST BIRTHDAY.**

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2007.
