Department of Agriculture - Appointment or Employment - Exemption from Ethics Restrictions

FOR the purpose of providing that a person who owns or operates a farm that is
subject to the regulatory authority of the Department of Agriculture may be
appointed Secretary or deputy secretary of the Department or employed by the

10	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

14	(a) The head of the Department is the Secretary of Agriculture, who shall be
15	appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate.
16	(b) The Secretary shall receive the salary provided in the State budget. He
10	(b) The Secretary shall receive the salary provided in the State budget. He serves at the pleasure of the Governor and is responsible directly to the Governor. The
18	Secretary shall counsel and advise the Governor on all matters assigned to the
19	Department of Agriculture and is responsible for carrying out the Governor's policies
20	with respect to these matters. The Secretary shall be responsible for the operation of
21	the Department and shall establish guidelines and procedures to promote the orderly
22	and efficient administration of the Department.
23	(c) The Secretary, with the approval of the Governor, shall appoint a deputy
24	secretary who has the duties provided by law or delegated by the Secretary. The
25	deputy secretary serves at the pleasure of the Secretary and shall receive the salary
26	provided in the State budget.
27	(d) (1) (i) The Secretary also shall have within the Department
28	assistants, professional consultants, and employees as provided in the State budget.
29	(ii) Assistants in charge of areas of responsibility and
30	professional consultants shall be in the executive service, management service, or
31	special appointments in the State Personnel Management System and shall serve at
32	the pleasure of the Secretary.

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1 (iii) Wherever it is provided by law that the Secretary makes an 2 appointment to a particular office within the Department with the approval of the 3 Governor, the Secretary may not remove the appointee without first obtaining the 4 Governor's approval.

5 (2) Except as otherwise provided by law, the Secretary shall appoint 6 and remove all other personnel in accordance with the provisions of the State 7 Personnel and Pensions Article.

8 (3) The Secretary may delegate the authority to appoint and remove 9 personnel of any unit to the administrator of the unit.

10 **(E)** (1) **NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF §§ 15–502 THROUGH** 11 15-504 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO OWNS OR 12 OPERATES A FARM THAT IS SUBJECT TO THE REGULATORY AUTHORITY OF THE DEPARTMENT MAY BE APPOINTED AS SECRETARY OR DEPUTY SECRETARY OF 13 THE DEPARTMENT OR EMPLOYED WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT, IF THE 14 INDIVIDUAL, WITH RESPECT TO THE FARM ACTIVITIES OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S 15 16 FARM, DOES NOT EXERCISE ANY REGULATORY OR SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY IN THE INDIVIDUAL'S CAPACITY AS AN EMPLOYEE OR APPOINTEE OF THE 17 18 **DEPARTMENT.**

19(2)THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE20ETHICS COMMISSION, SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO GOVERN CONFLICTS OF21INTEREST WITH RESPECT TO EMPLOYMENT OF INDIVIDUALS WHO OWN OR22OPERATE A FARM UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.

23 <u>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED</u>, That on or before December 24 <u>31, 2010, the Department of Agriculture and the State Ethics Commission shall jointly</u> 25 <u>prepare and submit a report to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1246 of</u> 26 the State Government Article, that includes:

27 (a) The number of employees hired by the Department, on or after October 1,
28 2007, who own or operate a farm;

29 (b) The positions for which the employees identified in subsection (a) of this
30 section were hired; and

31 <u>(c)</u> <u>Information on how the Department addressed any conflict of interest or</u> 32 <u>potential conflict of interest in hiring the employees identified in subsection (a) of this</u> 33 section. SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
effect October 1, 2007.
