A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Department of Agriculture - Appointment or Employment - Exemption from Ethics Restrictions

FOR the purpose of providing that a person who owns or operates a farm that is
subject to the regulatory authority of the Department of Agriculture may be
appointed Secretary or deputy secretary of the Department or employed by the
Department, subject to a certain restriction; and generally relating to
appointment to or employment with the Department of Agriculture.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Agriculture

1 (a) The head of the Department is the Secretary of Agriculture, who shall be 2 appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate.

3 (b) The Secretary shall receive the salary provided in the State budget. He 4 serves at the pleasure of the Governor and is responsible directly to the Governor. The 5 Secretary shall counsel and advise the Governor on all matters assigned to the 6 Department of Agriculture and is responsible for carrying out the Governor's policies 7 with respect to these matters. The Secretary shall be responsible for the operation of 8 the Department and shall establish guidelines and procedures to promote the orderly 9 and efficient administration of the Department.

10 (c) The Secretary, with the approval of the Governor, shall appoint a deputy 11 secretary who has the duties provided by law or delegated by the Secretary. The 12 deputy secretary serves at the pleasure of the Secretary and shall receive the salary 13 provided in the State budget.

14 (d) (1) (i) The Secretary also shall have within the Department 15 assistants, professional consultants, and employees as provided in the State budget.

16 (ii) Assistants in charge of areas of responsibility and 17 professional consultants shall be in the executive service, management service, or 18 special appointments in the State Personnel Management System and shall serve at 19 the pleasure of the Secretary.

(iii) Wherever it is provided by law that the Secretary makes an
 appointment to a particular office within the Department with the approval of the
 Governor, the Secretary may not remove the appointee without first obtaining the
 Governor's approval.

(2) Except as otherwise provided by law, the Secretary shall appoint
 and remove all other personnel in accordance with the provisions of the State
 Personnel and Pensions Article.

27 (3) The Secretary may delegate the authority to appoint and remove
 28 personnel of any unit to the administrator of the unit.

(E) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF §§ 15–502 THROUGH
15–504 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO OWNS OR
OPERATES A FARM THAT IS SUBJECT TO THE REGULATORY AUTHORITY OF THE
DEPARTMENT MAY BE APPOINTED AS SECRETARY OR DEPUTY SECRETARY OF
THE DEPARTMENT OR EMPLOYED WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT, IF THE
INDIVIDUAL, WITH RESPECT TO THE FARM ACTIVITIES OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S

FARM, DOES NOT EXERCISE ANY REGULATORY OR SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY IN
 THE INDIVIDUAL'S CAPACITY AS AN EMPLOYEE OR APPOINTEE OF THE
 DEPARTMENT.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2007.
