## 1 AN ACT concerning

# Department of Agriculture - Appointment or Employment - Exemption from Ethics Restrictions

FOR the purpose of providing that a person who owns or operates a farm that is
subject to the regulatory authority of the Department of Agriculture may be
appointed Secretary or deputy secretary of the Department or employed by the
Department, subject to a certain restriction; requiring the Department, in
consultation with the State Ethics Commission, to adopt certain regulations;
and generally relating to appointment to or employment with the Department of

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1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### Article – Agriculture

4 2–102.

5 (a) The head of the Department is the Secretary of Agriculture, who shall be 6 appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate.

7 (b) The Secretary shall receive the salary provided in the State budget. He 8 serves at the pleasure of the Governor and is responsible directly to the Governor. The 9 Secretary shall counsel and advise the Governor on all matters assigned to the 10 Department of Agriculture and is responsible for carrying out the Governor's policies 11 with respect to these matters. The Secretary shall be responsible for the operation of 12 the Department and shall establish guidelines and procedures to promote the orderly 13 and efficient administration of the Department.

(c) The Secretary, with the approval of the Governor, shall appoint a deputy secretary who has the duties provided by law or delegated by the Secretary. The deputy secretary serves at the pleasure of the Secretary and shall receive the salary provided in the State budget.

18 (d) (1) (i) The Secretary also shall have within the Department 19 assistants, professional consultants, and employees as provided in the State budget.

(ii) Assistants in charge of areas of responsibility and
 professional consultants shall be in the executive service, management service, or
 special appointments in the State Personnel Management System and shall serve at
 the pleasure of the Secretary.

(iii) Wherever it is provided by law that the Secretary makes an
 appointment to a particular office within the Department with the approval of the
 Governor, the Secretary may not remove the appointee without first obtaining the
 Governor's approval.

(2) Except as otherwise provided by law, the Secretary shall appoint
 and remove all other personnel in accordance with the provisions of the State
 Personnel and Pensions Article.

31 (3) The Secretary may delegate the authority to appoint and remove
 32 personnel of any unit to the administrator of the unit.

**NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF §§ 15–502 THROUGH** 1 **(E)** (1) 2 15-504 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO OWNS OR 3 **OPERATES A FARM THAT IS SUBJECT TO THE REGULATORY AUTHORITY OF THE** 4 DEPARTMENT MAY BE APPOINTED AS SECRETARY OR DEPUTY SECRETARY OF 5 THE DEPARTMENT OR EMPLOYED WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT, IF THE 6 INDIVIDUAL, WITH RESPECT TO THE FARM ACTIVITIES OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S FARM, DOES NOT EXERCISE ANY REGULATORY OR SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY IN 7 THE INDIVIDUAL'S CAPACITY AS AN EMPLOYEE OR APPOINTEE OF THE 8 9 **DEPARTMENT.** 

10(2)THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE11ETHICS COMMISSION, SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO GOVERN CONFLICTS OF12INTEREST WITH RESPECT TO EMPLOYMENT OF INDIVIDUALS WHO OWN OR13OPERATE A FARM UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 October 1, 2007.
