CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

Environment - Testing and Inspection for Volatile Organic Compounds Monitoring for Drinking Water Contaminants - Public Schools

4 FOR the purpose of requiring authorizing the Secretary of the Environment to adopt 5 certain regulations to conduct certain testing and inspection of the water in certain public schools for volatile organic compounds; authorizing the Secretary 6 7 to adopt certain regulations to provide for biannual testing and inspection of certain public schools under certain circumstances; require the monitoring of 8 9 the water in certain public schools for certain drinking water contaminants; requiring the Department of the Environment to use certain assessments to 10 11 determine certain monitoring and sampling frequency; requiring a certain supplier of water to provide notice to the Department of the Environment and 12 certain persons if certain drinking water contaminants exceed a certain health 13 advisory; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to the 14 testing and inspection of public schools for volatile organic compounds. 15 monitoring of public schools for drinking water contaminants. 16

2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 3 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 6 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO DRINKING WATER CONTAMINANTS THAT
 7 ARE NOT REGULATED BY DRINKING WATER REGULATIONS ADOPTED IN
 8 ACCORDANCE WITH § 9–407 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 9 (A) (B) **(1)** NOTWITHSTANDING § 9-407(B) OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CONDUCT ANNUAL TESTING AND 10 11 **INSPECTION** MAY REQUIRE MONITORING OF THE WATER IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN 12 THE STATE THAT ARE SERVED BY WELL WATER FOR VOLATILE ORGANIC 13 COMPOUNDS DEFINED AS A PUBLIC WATER SYSTEM FOR DRINKING WATER 14 CONTAMINANTS THAT MAY POSE A RISK TO PUBLIC HEALTH ACCORDING TO A DRINKING WATER HEALTH ADVISORY ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT. 15
- 16 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL USE SOURCE WATER ASSESSMENTS
 17 AND THE POTENTIAL SOURCES OF CONTAMINATION TO DETERMINE THE
 18 MONITORING AND SAMPLING FREQUENCY.
- 19 (C) IF A DRINKING WATER CONTAMINANT EXCEEDS A FEDERAL OR
 20 DEPARTMENTAL HEALTH ADVISORY, A SUPPLIER OF WATER SHALL GIVE NOTICE
 21 TO THE DEPARTMENT AND THE PERSONS SERVED BY THE SYSTEM IN
 22 ACCORDANCE WITH § 9–410 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 23 (B) IF 2 CONSECUTIVE YEARS PASS DURING WHICH THE PRESENCE OF A
 24 VOLATILE ORGANIC COMPOUND IS NOT DETECTED, THE SECRETARY MAY
 25 ADOPT REGULATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR BIANNUAL TESTING AND INSPECTION OF
 26 THE PUBLIC SCHOOL THEREAFTER.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2007.
