CHAPTER
AN ACT concerning
Natural Resources - Forest Conservation - Net Tract Area
FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "net tract area" for forest conservation requirements and forest mitigation bank credits to include certain forested areas of certain tracts of land partially within 100—year floodplains or wetlands under certain circumstances; including in the definition of "net tract area" a nontidal wetland, stream buffer, and the forested area of a 100—year floodplain or wetland under certain circumstances; providing for the application of this Act; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the forest conservation program.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act may not be construed to prevent any person that submitted submits a forest conservation plan before October July 1, 2007, to the State or local authority in accordance with 55–1605 of the Natural Resources Article, and has not been issued a building permit from revising the net tract area, for a tract of land of at least 350 acres of which at least 15% is within the boundaries of a 100-year floodplain or wetland, to include the forested area within the boundaries of a the 100-year floodplain or wetland.

It shall remain effective for a period of 8 months and, at the end of February 29, 2008, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
