1 WHEREAS, Public agencies concerned with the health of Maryland children 2 need periodic surveys to acquire data in order to determine appropriate preventive 3 education, regulations, and services; and

4 WHEREAS, Federal and State laws mandate the periodic collection of data 5 regarding the use of tobacco, alcohol, and other drugs by the youth of the State; and

6 WHEREAS, The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention 7 provides a Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System survey to states which generates 8 health risk data in a broad range of areas has established and maintains, in 9 collaboration with the states, systems for the collection of data regarding the use of 10 tobacco, alcohol, and other drugs by youth, including the Youth Tobacco Survey and 11 the Youth Risk Behavior Survey; and

12 WHEREAS, The national nature of the Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance 13 System survey these surveys enables states to compare the risk behaviors of their 14 children with those of children in other parts of the country and is required data for 15 the receipt of certain federal grant funding; and

16 WHEREAS, In 2004, the Maryland General Assembly passed legislation 17 requiring that the Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System survey be administered 18 every 2 years in a randomly selected sample of Maryland schools; and

19 WHEREAS, The administration of surveys requires substantial time and effort20 by Maryland schools; and

WHEREAS, The Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System survey obtains some of the data required for the Maryland Adolescent Survey and the Youth Tobacco Survey and can be modified to obtain all legally required data on the use of tobacco, alcohol, and other drugs It is desirable to minimize the administrative impact of these surveys on both students and schools in order to improve the quality and validity of the data collected; now, therefore,

- 5 SECTION 3. <u>2.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 6 effect October July 1, 2007. <u>It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the</u> 7 <u>end of June 30, 2009, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act</u>
- 8 <u>shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.</u>
