15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Health – General

18 5–608.

(a) (1) Certified or licensed emergency medical services personnel shall be
 directed by protocol to follow emergency medical services "do not resuscitate orders"
 pertaining to adult patients in the outpatient setting in accordance with protocols

3 (2) Emergency medical services "do not resuscitate orders" may not 4 authorize the withholding of medical interventions, or therapies deemed necessary to 5 provide comfort care or to alleviate pain.

6 (3) A health care provider, other than certified or licensed emergency 7 medical services personnel, WHO SEES, IN A VALID FORM, AN EMERGENCY 8 MEDICAL SERVICES "DO NOT RESUSCITATE ORDER" DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH 9 (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION THAT IS NOT SUPERSEDED BY A SUBSEQUENT 10 PHYSICIAN'S ORDER:

11 **(I)** [may] MAY, BEFORE A PATIENT'S CARDIAC OR 12 **RESPIRATORY ARREST,** provide, withhold, or withdraw treatment in accordance with [an emergency medical services "do not resuscitate order" described in paragraph (1) 13 14 of this subsection if a health care provider sees either the order or a valid, legible, and 15 patient identifying emergency medical services "do not resuscitate order" in bracelet 16 form] THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES "DO NOT RESUSCITATE ORDER": AND 17

18 (II) SHALL, AFTER A PATIENT'S CARDIAC OR RESPIRATORY
 19 ARREST, WITHHOLD OR WITHDRAW TREATMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
 20 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES "DO NOT RESUSCITATE ORDER".

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2007.
