BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Health – General Section 5–608(a) Annotated Code of Maryland (2005 Replacement Volume and 2006 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 2 (a) (1) Certified or licensed emergency medical services personnel shall be 3 directed by protocol to follow emergency medical services "do not resuscitate orders" 4 pertaining to adult patients in the outpatient setting in accordance with protocols 5 established by the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems in 6 conjunctions with the State Board of Physicians.
 - (2) Emergency medical services "do not resuscitate orders" may not authorize the withholding of medical interventions, or therapies deemed necessary to provide comfort care or to alleviate pain.
- 10 (3) A health care provider, other than certified or licensed emergency 11 medical services personnel, WHO SEES, IN A VALID FORM, AN EMERGENCY 12 MEDICAL SERVICES "DO NOT RESUSCITATE ORDER" DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH 13 (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION THAT IS NOT SUPERSEDED BY A SUBSEQUENT 14 PHYSICIAN'S ORDER:
- (I) [may] MAY, BEFORE A PATIENT'S CARDIAC OR
 RESPIRATORY ARREST, provide, withhold, or withdraw treatment in accordance with
 [an emergency medical services "do not resuscitate order" described in paragraph (1)
 of this subsection if a health care provider sees either the order or a valid, legible, and
 patient identifying emergency medical services "do not resuscitate order" in bracelet
 form] THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES "DO NOT RESUSCITATE ORDER";
 AND
- 22 (II) SHALL, AFTER A PATIENT'S CARDIAC OR RESPIRATORY 23 ARREST, WITHHOLD OR WITHDRAW TREATMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 24 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES "DO NOT RESUSCITATE ORDER".
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 26 October 1, 2007.
