A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Elections – Election Judges – Shifts at Polling Places on Election Day

- FOR the purpose of authorizing a local board of elections to appoint an election judge to serve for part of a day at a polling place on election day; specifying that a local board shall apportion the compensation for an election judge on the basis
- 6 of each day or part of a day that the election judge serves; and generally relating
- 7 to shifts for election judges at polling places on election day.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Election Law
10-203.
(a) The election director, with the approval of the local board[,]:
(1) shall appoint the election judges for each polling place for a term that begins on the Tuesday that is 13 weeks before each statewide primary election; AND
