A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative - Carbon Allowances

3 FOR the purpose of requiring carbon dioxide emission allowances allocated to the 4 State under the cap and trade mechanism of the Regional Greenhouse Gas 5 Initiative to be sold in an auction open to the public; requiring the Department of the Environment to adopt regulations to establish a certain auction system; 6 7 requiring certain regulations to include certain information; requiring the 8 proceeds from a certain auction to be used for certain purposes; requiring the 9 Department and the Maryland Energy Administration to work in consultation 10 with each other regarding certain proceeds and a certain fund; requiring proceeds from a certain auction to be deposited into a certain fund; establishing 11 12 the Energy Efficiency Utility Fund; providing for the administration and funding sources of the Fund; and generally relating to carbon allowances under 13 14 the cap and trade system of the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative.

6 7	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10 11 12	(g) (1) Not later than June 30, 2007, the Governor shall include the State as a full participant in the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative among Mid–Atlantic and Northeast states.
13 14 15	(2) The State may withdraw from the Initiative, as provided in the December 20, 2005 memorandum of understanding of the Initiative, at any time after January 1, 2009.
16 17 18	(3) If the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative expires and there is a successor organization with the same purposes and goals, the Governor is encouraged to join the State in the successor organization.
19 20 21	(4) If the State's participation in the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative ceases for any reason, the Governor shall report to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, regarding:
22	(i) Why participation ceased; and
23 24 25	(ii) A plan to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from power plants in the State that considers the use of Maryland grown, native, warm season grasses as a possible method of reducing carbon emissions.

27 28 29 30	(A) ANY CARBON ALLOWANCES THAT ARE ALLOCATED TO THE STATE AS PART OF THE CAP AND TRADE SYSTEM UNDER THE REGIONAL GREENHOUSE GAS INITIATIVE SHALL BE SOLD BY THE DEPARTMENT THROUGH AN AUCTION OPEN TO THE PUBLIC.

1	(B) (1) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2008, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
2	ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT ESTABLISH AN AUCTION SYSTEM FOR THE CARBON

- 6 (C) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ADMINISTER THE FUND IN 7 CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT.
- 8 (D) THE FUND IS A SPECIAL, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT SUBJECT 9 TO § 7–302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.
- 10 **(E)** THE FUND SHALL:
- 11 (1) BE SELF-SUSTAINING; AND
- 12 (2) CONSIST OF PROCEEDS DEPOSITED FROM THE CARBON
- 13 ALLOWANCE AUCTION ESTABLISHED UNDER § 2–1002.1 OF THE ENVIRONMENT
- 14 **ARTICLE.**
- 15 **(F)** MONEYS IN THE FUND MAY NOT REVERT OR BE TRANSFERRED TO 16 THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.
- 17 (G) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE FUND
- 18 SHALL BE USED ONLY FOR THE PURPOSES DESCRIBED UNDER § 2–1002.1(C) OF
- 19 THE ENVIRONMENT ARTICLE.
- 20 (2) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY USE MONEYS IN THE FUND FOR
- 21 ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS RELATED TO MANAGEMENT OF THE FUND, BUT MAY
- 22 NOT SPEND MORE THAN 7 PERCENT OF THE MONEYS IN THE FUND FOR
- 23 ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
