1 AN ACT concerning

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Commercial Law - Maryland Energy Consumer Protection Act

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the sale of crude oil, gasoline, or petroleum distillates at an unconscionably excessive price; requiring certain circumstances to be 4 5 taken into account in determining whether certain products have been sold at 6 an unconscionably excessive price; requiring certain circumstances to be 7 considered as mitigating factors in determining whether certain products have 8 been sold at an unconscionably excessive price; providing that a violation of 9 certain provisions of this Act is an unfair or deceptive trade practice under the 10 Maryland Energy Consumer Protection Act and is subject to certain enforcement and penalty provisions; authorizing the Governor to control the 11 12 sale of crude oil, gasoline, and petroleum distillates under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the sale of crude oil, gasoline, and 13 petroleum distillates and the Maryland Energy Consumer Protection Act. 14
