A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission Park Police Workers' Compensation - Lyme Disease Presumption

MC/PG 113-07

FOR the purpose of applying the occupational disease presumption under the workers' 5 6 compensation law to park police officers employed by the Maryland-National 7 Capital Park and Planning Commission (MNCPPC) who contract Lyme disease under specified circumstances; providing that park police officers who are 8 9 eligible for benefits under this Act shall receive the benefits in addition to certain retirement benefits, subject to a certain adjustment; and generally 10 relating to the occupational disease presumption for Lyme disease under the 11 workers' compensation law. 12

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (d) A paid law enforcement employee of the Department of Natural 2 Resources who is a covered employee under § 9–207 of this title AND A PARK POLICE 3 OFFICER OF THE MARYLAND-NATIONAL CAPITAL PARK AND PLANNING 4 COMMISSION is presumed to have an occupational disease that was suffered in the 5 line of duty and is compensable under this title if the employee:

(1) is suffering from Lyme disease; and

7 (2) was not suffering from Lyme disease before assignment to a 8 position that regularly places the employee in an outdoor wooded environment.

9 Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, any paid (e) (1)10 firefighter, paid fire fighting instructor, sworn member of the Office of the State Fire Marshal, paid police officer, paid law enforcement employee of the Department of 11 12 Natural Resources, A PARK POLICE OFFICER OF THE MARYLAND-NATIONAL 13 CAPITAL PARK AND PLANNING COMMISSION, deputy sheriff of Montgomery County, deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, 14 deputy sheriff of Prince George's County, or Prince George's County correctional officer 15 who is eligible for benefits under subsection (a), (b), (c), or (d) of this section shall 16 17 receive the benefits in addition to any benefits that the individual is entitled to receive 18 under the retirement system in which the individual was a participant at the time of the claim. 19

(2) The benefits received under this title shall be adjusted so that the
weekly total of those benefits and retirement benefits does not exceed the weekly
salary that was paid to the paid law enforcement employee of the Department of
Natural Resources, A PARK POLICE OFFICER OF THE MARYLAND-NATIONAL
CAPITAL PARK AND PLANNING COMMISSION, firefighter, fire fighting instructor,
sworn member of the Office of the State Fire Marshal, police officer, deputy sheriff, or
Prince George's County or Montgomery County correctional officer.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2007.
