BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Labor and Employment Section 9–503 (d) and (e) Annotated Code of Maryland (1999 Replacement Volume and 2006 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 6 Resources who is a covered employee under § 9–207 of this title AND A PARK POLICE
  7 OFFICER OF THE MARYLAND-NATIONAL CAPITAL PARK AND PLANNING
  8 COMMISSION is presumed to have an occupational disease that was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if the employee:
- 10 (1) is suffering from Lyme disease; and
- 11 (2) was not suffering from Lyme disease before assignment to a 12 position that regularly places the employee in an outdoor wooded environment.
- 13 Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, any paid 14 firefighter, paid fire fighting instructor, sworn member of the Office of the State Fire 15 Marshal, paid police officer, paid law enforcement employee of the Department of 16 Natural Resources, A PARK POLICE OFFICER OF THE MARYLAND-NATIONAL CAPITAL PARK AND PLANNING COMMISSION, deputy sheriff of Montgomery 17 18 County, deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, deputy sheriff of Prince George's County, or Prince George's County correctional officer 19 who is eligible for benefits under subsection (a), (b), (c), or (d) of this section shall 20 21 receive the benefits in addition to any benefits that the individual is entitled to receive 22 under the retirement system in which the individual was a participant at the time of the claim. 23
  - (2) The benefits received under this title shall be adjusted so that the weekly total of those benefits and retirement benefits does not exceed the weekly salary that was paid to the paid law enforcement employee of the Department of Natural Resources, A PARK POLICE OFFICER OF THE MARYLAND-NATIONAL CAPITAL PARK AND PLANNING COMMISSION, firefighter, fire fighting instructor, sworn member of the Office of the State Fire Marshal, police officer, deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County or Montgomery County correctional officer.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2007.
