CHAPTER	
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1 AN ACT concerning

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Task Force to Combat Driving Under the Influence of Drugs and Alcohol

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Combat Driving Under the 4 Influence of Drugs and Alcohol; providing for the membership of the Task Force; 5 requiring the Governor to request that a certain representative participate in the Task Force; designating the chair of the Task Force; providing for the 6 7 staffing for the Task Force; providing that a member of the Task Force may not 8 receive certain compensation, but is entitled to a certain reimbursement; 9 establishing the duties of the Task Force; requiring the Task Force to submit interim and final reports to the Governor and the General Assembly on or 10 before certain dates; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally 11 relating to the Task Force to Combat Driving Under the Influence of Drugs and 12 13 Alcohol.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That:

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effe July 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 6 months and, at the end of December 31, 2008, with no further action required by the General Assemble this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
