## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning 2 Task Force on the Future for Growth and Development - Membership and 3 Charge 4 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Task Force on the Future for Growth and Development; altering the requirements of the Task Force to 5 6 include certain examinations, recommendations, and determinations concerning certain growth-related issues; requiring the Task Force to submit a certain 7 8 preliminary report on or before a certain date; altering the date by which the 9 Task Force must make a certain report; making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to the Task Force on the Future for Growth and 10 Development. 11 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 12 13 Chapter 381 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2006 Section 4 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 16

- 10 **(2)** THE TASK FORCE SHALL REPORT BOTH ITS PRELIMINARY
  11 AND FINAL FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS to the Speaker of the House, the
  12 President of the Senate, the House Environmental Matters Committee, the Senate
  13 Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee, and the Governor, in
  14 accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article.
